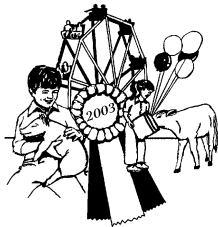

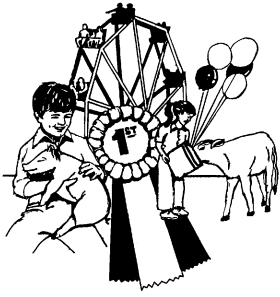

All fair exhibit buildings close at 10:00 PM daily.

GATE & ADMISSIONS: Service gate at Southeast entrance of the Fairgrounds will be open until 4:00 PM except Saturdays and Sundays. On these days the service gate will be closed and locked at 12:00 PM and paid admission begins.

Adult admission (12 & older) - \$7.00

Child admission - \$3.00

5 & under free when accompanied by an adult

Every person entering the grounds must have a ticket.

ADMINISTRATION OFFICE: The President and Fair Manager of the Lake County Fair maintain headquarters at the Fair Office on the southwest end of the Fairgrounds.

REST ROOMS: Rest room facilities are available in the Clements and Commercial building. Baby changing stations are provided in the Commercial building restrooms.

FIRST AID: First aid care will be available during scheduled Fair hours to render emergency service under the competent direction of volunteer trained personnel. Ambulance service will be available if needed.

LOST AND FOUND: A Lost and Found Department is maintained at the Administration office.

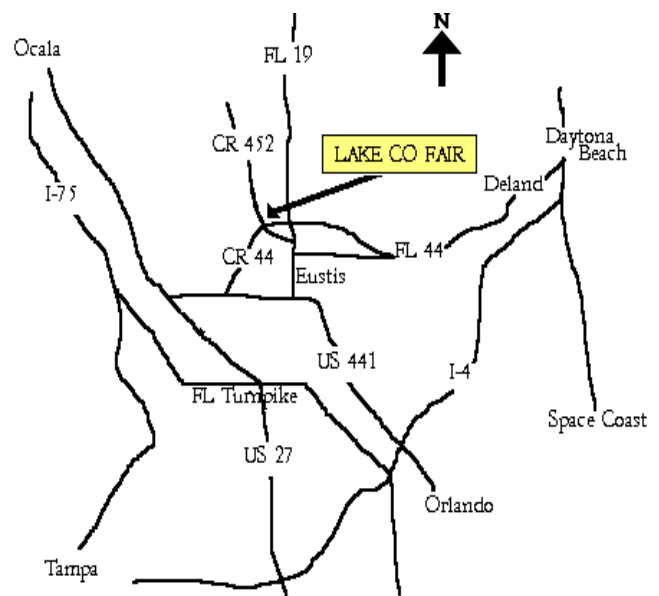
LITTER: We appreciate your cooperation in helping us maintain clean and attractive fairgrounds. Disposal cans will be provided in convenient locations, in exhibit areas, and parking areas.

SECURITY: Fairgrounds will be policed by special security officers and night watchmen employed for your personal safety and for the protection of various group and individual exhibits. This service is provided with the interest and cooperation of the Lake County Fair Association.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE/DRINK CONTAINERS: No alcoholic beverages will be permitted on the Fairgrounds. Soft drinks may be served in paper cups,

approved cans or plastic bottles. NO GLASS BOTTLES PLEASE.

GENERAL RULES **EXHIBITORS**

WHO MAY ENTER COMPETITION

Premium lists throughout this book are open to all qualified FFA and 4-H members, and all other youth and adults who reside in Lake County.

Eligibility requirements are found under individual departments.

Notice: Students attending Lake County Schools Grades 1-12 will be considered Youth and will enter all departments accordingly.

See Livestock Premium Book for requirements for all animal exhibits.

ENTRY BLANKS

Entry blanks will be made available at check in. Department class and lot numbers must be on entry blanks, and must correspond to those in the Premium Book. Entry blanks must be presented on date specified in the specific department where entry is being made. Entry must be made by exhibitor with complete entry form.

LIABILITY

All property of every character, whether entered for exhibit or any other purpose, will be taken into the grounds and buildings and kept entirely at the risk of the owner who assumes all responsibility for loss, damage, or theft. It is distinctly understood that exhibitors, concessionaires, and all other persons, firms or corporations having property on the grounds and desiring protection from such loss or damage must make their own arrangements therefore.

The Lake County Fair will employ guards and traffic directors and will promote safety and protection of patrons, and their exhibits and property on the fairgrounds. But under no circumstances, will the Fair or any of its officers or employees be responsible for loss or damage to persons and their property (including exhibits, automobiles in parking lots, and articles left in cars) because of accidents, theft, fire, the elements, and other conditions.

PROTESTS

Judges have been carefully selected. All persons making entries accept these judges and agree to abide by their decisions. Protests upon any other grounds, or against other than judges, must be made out in writing on the same day in which protested action was taken, and given to the superintendent of the department concerned, who shall present such protest to the Fair officials. Parties filing protest must deposit \$100.00, to be forfeited if not sustained in complaint.

PLACEMENT AND REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS

For every article, animal, or fowl entered, a numbered entry tag or card will be filled out identifying entry. A

claim check with number corresponding to that on the entry tag shall be given to the exhibitor. This claim check must be presented to the proper official at the close of the Fair, when the articles are being called for and claimed. See individual departments for placement and removal times and dates. **Livestock exhibitors please refer to Livestock Premium Book for removal times and dates.** Exhibits cannot be removed before 10:00 PM Saturday, closing day of the Fair. See each department for removal times and dates. The Lake County Fair Association assumes no responsibility after removal time deadline. All items not claimed will be discarded by the Fair Association.

SECURITY

It is understood that the exhibits are entered in competition for prizes, and that the owner assumes all responsibility for an accident, loss or damage that may occur. Neither the Lake County Fair Association, Inc., the County of Lake, officers of the Association or its agents, will be held responsible for any loss, accident or damage.

SUNDAY AFTER FAIR - 1:00 PM TO 3:00 PM

1. Competition limited to residents of Lake County ONLY.
2. Open to adults – 18 years old (not in high school) and over.
3. No articles received by mail.
4. Decision of Judges is final.
5. All articles entered must be clean, finished and made by the Exhibitor within the past two (2) years. Articles having been previously shown at the Fair may NOT be entered.
6. The management has the right to place entry and make decision as to class.
7. All articles received will be entirely under the control and jurisdiction of the management of the Fair until after the close of the Fair. If emergency removal is necessary, exhibitor will forfeit premium money. **Exhibitor will not be allowed to remove, handle or rearrange the exhibit.** (If article must be removed it will be at the convenience of the Superintendent after Fair hours.)
8. The Fair assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage to exhibits from any cause; and upon this condition only, are entries received.
9. Tickets **will not** be issued to exhibitors in Creative Arts Department.
10. Premiums will not be paid according to ribbons, for ribbons may sometimes be attached through mistake, or may be misplaced or lost. The only guide for awards is Judges' records. Only articles deemed worthy will be awarded ribbons.
11. Stubs will be presented to claim articles. Articles left after Monday, following the close of the Fair, will become property of the Lake County Fair.
12. In the event that a disproportionate number of entrants in a category are worked in the same technique, the judges reserve the right to create a separate category for the technique.
13. Exhibitor may have two (2) entries per lot.
14. Each exhibitor is limited to 30 entries total.

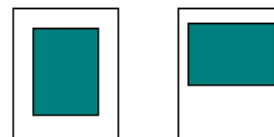

This can be done by most frame shops or photography shops or it can be done by using hot mounting tissue and an iron. *If you use spray mounting rather than dry mounting, please use a good spray, like 3M. There is no guarantee that the photograph will stay on the board when using a spray or any other adhesive.

4. Container grown plants must have been grown by exhibitor for at least 3 months; bedding plants, plant collections, dish gardens, terrariums and other multiple plants for at least 6 weeks.
5. Container grown plants must be exhibited in clean containers.
6. Entry tag must be filled out in pencil and include: exhibitor's name, common name of plant, botanical name (if known), the class number, lot number (if known) and the division (youth or adult).
7. Claim check will be issued for entry and must be presented for removal of item and premium payment. If removed by exhibitor prior to show, the exhibitor forfeits premium money.

8. All entries must be of specimen quality, free of insects and disease, with clean appearance.
9. Exhibits are not judged against each other, but against perfection, according to cultural perfection, color, form and condition/grooming.
10. All entries must be passed by the Horticulture Committee. Sub-standard entries will not be accepted.
11. A new class may be made at the discretion of the Horticulture Classification Committee and/or judges.
12. Each entry will be judged and awarded a Blue, Red or White ribbon. Premiums will be paid according to judging records, not ribbons placed on the exhibit.

Entrants can submit up to 5 entries, however, each entry must be in a different class. Photographs cannot be dually entered into more than one class. “**Photo Story**” (Class H) may have a min of 3 & a max of 5 photos submitted. On the back of the each photo should be the label/release statement, numbered to outline the sequence of the photos & to provide an explanation about your “**Photo Story**”. Label/release statement needs to be completely filled out and attached to every photo, along with a CD with digital image in .JPEG format. **Size & mounting of Photo:**—All prints must be securely & permanently mounted on a non-frame board that may be of 5mm foam board or mat board no larger than 8” X 10”. Masonite, photo folders, corrugated cardboard or thin poster board is not acceptable. Double faced tape, glue or rubber cement is not allowed for mounting purposes. An adhesive spray or special adhesive board is best. Mat Framing (of any kind) is not allowed & will result in disqualification. Only 1 per Class, except Class H.

Examples on how to apply a theme to a poster include: Illustrations of 4-H youth preparing healthy meals, 4-H curriculum icons, people speaking about 4-H at a county commission meeting, 4-H'ers working with the rocketry curriculum, anti-smoking themes, youth in a leadership role, or exploring beekeeping as a hobby. Posters must be designed on or affixed to poster board no larger than 14”x 22” & must be the original artwork of one 4-H member only. Poster depth cannot exceed .25” or it will be disqualified. Posters may be horizontal or vertical. Team entries are not eligible for judging. Posters incorporating copyrighted material (i.e. Snoopy, Garfield, company logos like Disney, etc.) will be disqualified, unless proof of permission is furnished. Posters using computer assistance to create components of the poster or the poster itself should affix a statement of 1 paragraph explaining how the computer assistance affected the poster’s composition & visual presentation. The 4-H Poster Contest Certification Statement Form must be signed by the contestant & securely attached to the back of the poster board in the upper right hand corner. Use of the 4-H Emblem must be in accordance to the graphic standards set by the USDA. 1 exhibit per Lot.
